A year of Debutantes

The theme for this year's report is definitely those making a team Debut.

If it's all even after 6 rubbers, the rules now dictate a 'shootout': 2 singles victims must be nominated and the other lucky players get to play doubles, so 3 more rubbers are played, each of a match tiebreak.

The women were playing in the highest division this summer. Any higher and you go 'National' i.e. gallivant around the whole country. So division 1 was tough competition and we had some matches which hinged on that final set tiebreak. Sadly, we didn't clinch them, so this summer we are back to Division 2.

Middlesex Cup

The Middlesex Cup is a doubles only knock-out competition, requiring teams of 6 and the order you play the opposite pairs is determined by pulling from the hat at the start of the fixture.

In the winter, the Middlesex cup is Mixed only but usually a high standard as there are only 3 divisions. In November, we lost to Will to Win Ealing.
