### The only constant is change

### Winter season 2021/22 - 9 competitions


In the Winter floodlit, 1 x mixed, 3 x ladies teams, 3 x men's team and 2 x vets teams.


The winter floodlit season was started in September 2020 and runs to March 2021 but abandoned due to Covid and lockdowns.
